ISLAM – MUHAMMAD’S LIFE IN MAKKAH

VOCABULARY

Prophet	a person who predicts the future.
Muslim	a person who follows the religion of Islam.
Qur’an	the sacred book of Islam that is the basis of Muslim religion. Muslims believe that Allah gave the words of the Qur’an to the prophet Muhammad. The Qur’an is written in Arabic.
Mosque	a Muslim place of worship.
Polytheism	the belief in more than one god.
Monotheism	the belief that there is only one supreme being.
Deity	a god or goddess.
Convert	to change into a different form or state.
Preaching	to present or deliver a talk on a religious or moral subject.
Torture	the intentional causing of great physical or emotional pain to a person or animal.
Slavery	the owning of people by other people.
Muezzin	the Muslim religious functionary who calls the faithful to prayer five times a day.
Minaret	a tall, thin tower on a mosque. A minaret has a platform near the top from which a person calls Muslims to prayer.
Ka’ba	a building in the courtyard of the Great Mosque in Mecca, to which Muslims make a yearly pilgrimage.

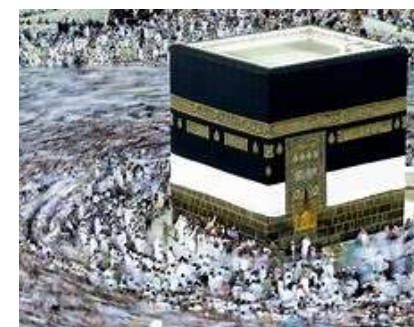
