Celebration	a party or anything else that people do to honour a special event.
Tomb	a structure built to hold the bodies of one or more dead persons.
Disciple	someone who follows a leader or teacher. In the Bible, Jesus originally had 12 disciples
Jesus	the teacher and prophet who founded the Christian faith. He is considered by Christians to be the son of God and the Christ or saviour.
Resurrection	a return to life after death.
Crucifixion	a method of execution in which the condemned person is tied or nailed to a cross.
Gospel	the lessons taught by Jesus Christ and his apostles.
Believe	To accept something to be honest or true
