



Earrings

This week I have had guite a few parents ask about earrings and PE. Having spoken to other headteachers in Dudley and seeking advice, I was directed to the PE Association Health & Safety Guidance.

It strongly recommends the practice of removing all jewellery at the commencement of every PE lesson to establish a safe working environment. We do not accept taping over ear piercings as a measure of protection because the teacher supervising the group has the legal responsibility to ensure the taping is fit for purpose.

If a health and safety incident was to occur, this would mean that the teacher is liable which is why we have taken the stance that earrings must NOT be worn for PE.

Parents must either remove earrings on the day of PE or if able, the child can remove them but schools hold no responsibility for this. PE is a compulsory subject under the National Curriculum at all key stages; so we ask for your support with this.

It is essential that we keep all children safe.

We are continuing with the new initiative that we started last academic year. The aim is to encourage 🜟 more children and their families to walk to school. WOW - the walk to school challenge is delivered 🜟 by Living Streets, the UK charity for everyday walking, to help as many children as possible \mathbf{x} experience the benefits of walking to school. The pupil-led challenge enables children to self-report how they travel to school every day. If they travel actively (walk/wheel, cycle, scoot or Park and Stride) at least twice a week for a month, they get rewarded with a badge. It's that simple!

Park and Stride to help your child earn their WOW badge. You can park or hop off public transport at least ten minutes away from the school and walk the remaining journey. Badges

 \bigstar The badges this year are linked to the theme 'Bristish nature Walk'. Each badge has been designed by a pupil from across the UK as part of our annual WOW Badge Design Competition. A new badge can be $\frac{1}{2}$ ☆ earned every month if you walk/wheel, cycle, scoot or Park and Stride at least twice a week. \checkmark

If your child is due to start secondary school in 2023 then you will have to apply for a secondary school place before 5pm on 31st October 2023.

You must complete an application form either online at <u>www.dudley.gov.uk/admissions</u> or by completing the application form provided by your home local authority. You can include 6 school preferences on the application form.

You should not assume that your child will get a place at a secondary school without you having to apply, even if you have an older child already attending the same school. This is a common misconception and often the biggest cause of disappointment for parents who believe otherwise.
